Our youngest volunteer has been busy at work over Christmas making feeders which we are putting up in strategic woods to see which squirrels are around.

Joe Shipley Smith aged 11 already has his own wildlife camera and has some lovely pictures of the local roe deer. He has made 4 feeders and we are about to install one in woods close to the village with his camera trained on it to see who visits.

Fingers crossed we will see a red visitor or two.

In the meantime there is a parliamentary petition on change.org to try to get landowners who are within 100 miles of Red squirrel populations to control Grey squirrels on their land, with a view to creating a strong buffer zone to protect the reds.if you're able to sign this it would be much appreciated.
